PRESS RELEASE THE DONATION MARIE-ALINE PRAT

26 SEPTEMBER - 4 NOVEMBER 2018

MUSÉE, SALLE FOCUS, LEVEL 5

Thanks to the exceptional generosity of Marie-Aline Prat, the Centre Pompidou acquired eight major works in October 2017 from Jean-François and Marie-Aline Prat's contemporary art collection.

The donation was made on the occasion of the "Regards croisés. Collection Jean-François et Marie-Aline Prat" sale held in Paris, via which Marie-Aline Prat disposed of the works she had acquired with her husband, the great business lawyer, who died in 2011. It was Jean-François Prat's wish to dispose of this collection in order to start over and build a new one, and so it came to pass.

The Prat collection, one of the most remarkable to be assembled by private collectors in France, stands out because of its open-mindedness and the assuredness of its acquisitions, in terms of recent art history. Born of a shared passion, it is, at the same time, an example of the sort of gamble that every great collector takes. With the assistance of his teams, Bernard Blistène, director of the Musée National d'Art Moderne, has made a selection that reflects this incredible originality.

On show as a result are eight works produced between 1961 and 2009 – three by French artists, three by Americans and two by Britons.

Martin Barré's painting entitled 61-T-36 is a reminder of the continuing importance of one of the most original abstract painters of the post-war period, while Richard Stankiewicz's Ain't coming out until, also from 1961 and featuring components of soldered iron, embodies the junk sculpture style.

Tony Cragg also makes use of recovered materials in his Self-portrait (1981) depicting him as a cyclist (and created especially for the Prats), which energetically combines the assemblage and ready-made approaches. Exuberant relative #1 (1986), by Haim Steinbach, takes us back to 1980s art, in which manufactured objects featured strongly, while the paintings Melker II (2004), by Bertrand Lavier, and Sixth Sense (1999), by Peter Halley, are each, in their own way, examples of the post-modern resurgence of abstract painting. On the figurative side, Gary Hume's The Moon (2009) mixes the pop aesthetic with photographic cropping in a large mural that has undeniable chromatic power.

Finally, the youngest member of the group, Mathieu Mercier, born in 1970, brings everything full circle with his lasso of white neon suspended from a peg (Sans titre, 2006), which can be seen as an echo of the Martin Barré work that opens this segment, which is full of unexpected twists and turns.
