# UGO RONDINONE ROUNDELAY

The installation comprises six videos projected on six large walls in a purpose-designed setting.

A feature of today's scene is artists' growing interest in the creation of increasingly complex audiovisual works. These require substantial, fully professional production facilities which the Centre Pompidou, Musée National d'Art Moderne can now provide. *Roundelay* is thus part of a production programme launched in 1984.

Works recently produced and presented by the Centre Pompidou include *The Third Memory* (1999) by Pierre Huyghe, *Dial History* (1997) by Johan Grimonprez, *Immemory* (1997) by Chris Marker, *Switch* (1996) by Tony Oursler, and *Hors-champs* (1992) by Stan Douglas.

Born in Brunnen, Switzerland in 1964, Ugo Rondinone now enjoys an international reputation. Something of a solitary, he is engaged in a quest for identity based on the status of the artist in a changing society in which art is historically marginal. Working across the entire artistic spectrum, he is committed to a conceptual approach using installations, photography, painting, sculpture, neon, Indian ink drawings and poetry.

Covering an area of 220 m<sup>2</sup> and pursuing the investigation of space and projection begun in *Where do we go from here* (1996) and It's late and *the wind carries a faint sound...* (1999), *Roundelay* places the viewer in an environment shaped by a specific artistic strategy.

The installation – an "unstable", truncated outdoor parallelepiped highly reminiscent of the minimalist set-ups of the 1960-70s – draws the viewer into a hexagonal space housing six large-scale projections. In an atmosphere of continuing uncertainty a complex montage involves the viewer with two characters, Joana Preiss and Gaston, as they pace endlessly through the architectural maze of a modernist Paris.

In his affinities with Samuel Beckett's TV work and certain films by Jean-Luc Godard and Rainer Werner Fassbinder, Ugo Rondinone reveals a remarkable capacity for the representation of space, recycling formal strategies that draw on settings created by Bruce Nauman and Richard Serra.

Via a range of references combining literature and the cinema, he achieves a re-reading of the visual parameters developed by Minimalism, as seen through a more cynically critical 21st-century filter.
